Trees on the Green in Chestnut Close

Several trees in the Village have been felled over the winter for a variety of reasons; some are dead, some are at risk of losing limbs and some are at risk of falling onto villagers' property.

The Parish Council has a policy of replacing any tree lost with a new one.

We were also contacted last year by some residents of Chestnut Close about planting more trees on the Green to increase the number of trees in the Village, to provide a shaded place to sit and to become a focal point on the Green.

With this in mind the Parish Council are writing to inform you that we would like to put two Sweet Chestnut trees on the end of the Green nearest the High Street. These would be placed to allowed space for them to grow.

We have also been contacted by South Cambs District Council who as a local authority are keen to plant additional trees on land that they own. So we are keen to give them the go ahead to plant one or two more trees on the Green in Chestnut Close.
