Consultation on the draft proposals for the local plan

The consultation went live at the beginning of November and runs until 5pm on 13th December.

Making Connections Consultation

The Greater Cambridge Partnership (GCP) has launched a fresh consultation on proposals to radically enhance bus and active travel journeys and reduce congestion in and around the city. This has not been the first such consultation, but it's been two years since the GCP last asked these questions and it's fair to say the world has changed somewhat since then! So before proceeding to develop more plans for public transport, and a revenue stream to support it, the GCP is seeking up to date views:

One new number for the District Council

From 10th November, the District Council Contact Centre moved to a single 'golden number' that people can call will call when they want to speak to Customer Contact Advisors on the phone. This single number, which is **01954 713 000**, replaces the existing suite of 03450 numbers. It will not cost anyone ringing any more money in call charges than the current 03450 number does, but will save the Council money (the council has been spending around £100,000 per year on having several different 03450 numbers).
